## Dr Dawnie Steadman

Dr. Steadman has been a Professor of Anthropology and the Director of the Forensic Anthropology Center at the University of Tennessee since August 2011. Prior to this she was a Professor at Binghamton University in Upstate New York and at Iowa State University. She earned her MA and PhD at the University of Chicago.

She is a Diplomate of the American Board of Forensic Anthropology and serves as a member of the Board and a Fellow of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences.

Her research involves forensic anthropology, bioarchaeology and forensic human rights investigations.

Her primary interests are in trauma analysis and the effects of trauma on past and present community health.

She has been involved in mass grave exhumations in Argentina, Cyprus, Spain and now Uganda. She is also a member of DMORT and has been deployed to the World Trade Center, the Noble Georgia Crematorium, and the Continental Airlines #3407 crash in Buffalo NY. She has written numerous journal articles and a book, "Hard Evidence: Case Studies in Forensic Anthropology," is in its second edition.
